- From where can/must the matching funds come?
 - Rule 2.2 (3) requires a 50% match. A portion of this match must be from “a county, municipality, or an affiliated organization (economic development corporation, regional planning and development council, etc) that dedicates funds through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), or other funding, to a broadband development initiative.” Awards under Rule 2.2(3) will receive 50% funding from the BEAM Fund and must provide a 50% or greater match demonstrating dedicated funding from a public partnership.
